Chaan emphasizes that the point of the study was not to find the value of urban congregations, but more to show that it can be done. Later studies may find even higher values: Chaan's researchers neglected to include the arts in their calculations (but also didn't count the negative effects of crowded parking and church noise). "A lot more work needs to be done," they said, adding that they expect many of the calculations to be challenged. "We take solace in the fact that valuing the cost of smoking tobacco or of clean water was thought to be impossible only 40 years ago."
