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Dear Superintendent Jefferson

It has come to my attention that on December 4<sup>th,</sup> 2019, during the Health Technology class at the High School, a yoga instructor directed a yoga session with young impressionable teenage students. It is my understanding that all the students were given yoga mats and participated in the exercise.

There is no doubt that yoga is a practice of Eastern Religion. The 1995 Self-Realization Fellowship Church vs. Ananda Church of Self Realization Federal Court case classified the "Hindu-Yoga spiritual tradition" as a "religious tradition."

Case in point, in 2016, the Pennsylvania' Board of Education found a yogabased charter school was in violation of laws prohibiting public schools from providing religious instruction.

Claims about health and educational benefits of yoga seldom note weaknesses in empirical evidence. Many studies are not peer-reviewed, therefore poor quality, using small sample sizes, without randomized controls and based on self-report data.

With media fanfare about the latest Hollywood celebrity or Washington D.C. politician promoting the benefits of yoga, parents may be unaware of more readily available alternatives thru scientific research that provide similar benefits, like napping, music, healthy lunches, or even aerobic exercise.

It is my opinion that the Mansfield City School District can utilize these healthy alternatives rather than the indoctrination of yoga. Thank you for your careful consideration. I am looking forward to your response.
