Ohio Clergy say 'Vote Yes' on Issue 1

Proverbs 14:15 states, "The simple believes everything, but the prudent gives thought to his steps."

On Tuesday, August 8th, Ohioans will vote on whether to raise the approval threshold to amend the Ohio State Constitution to sixty-percent (60%) of the vote instead of the current fifty-percent plus one. The proposed amendment will also require any initiative petition filed with the Secretary of State proposing to amend Constitution of the State of Ohio be signed by at least five-percent (5%) of the electors of every county. (1) Currently, signatures must be gathered for only 44 of Ohio's 88 counties.

As lead clergymen representing one hundred-twenty-four (124) diverse congregations, we believe the bar should be raised if a special interest group wants to amend the charter of our state. We believe it should be done by a broad consensus of at least sixty-percent (60%) of Ohioans.

Every public officer takes an oath to support the Ohio Constitution. Right now, two foundational pieces of Western Civilization, the sanctity of life and parents' rights are at risk.

This coming November 2023 election, Planned Parenthood and the ACLU will propose enshrining the murder of unborn babies into the Ohio Constitution and permitting underage minors to obtain gender-changing hormones and/or mutilate their bodies thru surgery without parental consent. (2) In future election cycles, amendments to legalize the gateway drug marijuana, and the repeal of election integrity laws are also expected. As faith leaders across seventeen counties, our firm conviction is that now is the time to safeguard our vulnerable State's fundamental principles.

Unlike the U.S. Constitution, our Ohio Constitution can easily be changed. This bare minimum threshold of fifty-percent plus one vote encourages the Secular Left to constantly bring defeated issues back before voters with more financial backing until they eventually pass. For comparison, the U.S. Constitution requires a two-thirds vote in both the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate, as well as 75% of state legislatures to formally ratify an amendment.

According to the National Archives Foundation, of the more than 11,000 proposed amendments to the U.S. Constitution throughout the nation's two centuries of its existence, only twenty-seven constitutional amendments have been ratified. (3) In contrast, the Ohio Constitution has been amended an astronomical 172 times. (4) Presently Massachusetts, Illinois, Oregon, Washington, Nevada, Nebraska, Mississippi, Wyoming, and Florida already require a supermajority to pass petition-based constitutional amendments. (5)

According to Founding Father Alexander Hamilton, government has been instituted, "because the passions of men will not conform to the dictate of reason and justice without constraint." (6) Changing the State Constitution should be a slow process that moderates the intense passions of people in order to provide long-term stability to our system. In other words, the bedrock document our state's laws are based on should not change at a whim's notice.

After the 2008 Great Recession hit and Ohio was struck with a \$900 billion state budget deficit, voters the following year approved a constitutional amendment by a slim 53-47% margin. (7) In a knee-jerk reaction, voters gave two predatory businesses a casino monopoly. Previously four state constitution casino initiatives had been defeated.

Like a chew toy by the biggest dog at the Statehouse, the State Constitution became a convenient toy of a monopoly industry that set the odds in its favor. (8) As faith leaders, we do not want the State Constitution and ballot box to become part of someone's corporate business plan.

Proverbs 19 states, "It is not good for a soul to be without knowledge. He who sins hastens with his feet. The foolishness of a man twists his way, and his heart frets against the Lord."

In closing, Article 1 Section 7 of the Ohio Constitution states religion, morality, and knowledge, are essential to good government. As the abortion industry tries to transform our Ohio Constitution into an erasable white board, may Ohio voters raise the bar on August 8th to protect our Constitution and preserve our rich heritage. Vote Yes for Issue 1.
